



Thank you for your interest in the **Historic Marker Program**. The Hampton Heritage Commission has established this program to recognize buildings in Hampton that contribute in some positive way to the appreciation and understanding of our unique architectural and historical heritage. They are intended for buildings that are at least 50 years old, are well maintained and that retain the integrity of their original design. The program is voluntary and does not impose any property restrictions. The markers will identify buildings of historical and architectural significance, and will serve to heighten community awareness, while encouraging the continued care and preservation of buildings and neighborhoods. These hand-painted building markers are custom made for us by *Ould Colony Artisans*. Featured on each marker is the date of your house's construction, and the Winnacunnet pine tree logo originally used during Hampton's Tri-Centennial Celebrations in 1938.

In this packet you will find the application and architectural form along with instructions on how to fill them out. Please submit these to the Hampton Heritage Commission, 100 Winnacunnet Rd. Be sure to include a check to **OULD COLONY ARTISANS** for \$62.00 (\$55.00 for marker plus \$7.00 for shipping and handling). The information will be reviewed and verified by the Commission at its next regular meeting, then forwarded to Ould Colony Artisans.

## Individual Structure Survey Form Instructions

**Street and Number (No.)** - List your street name and house number.

**Historic name** - The historic name could be the earliest known name, the name of the original owner, the name of the most significant occupant, or the building's most significant use. If several historic names are known, use the one most closely associated with the most notable aspects of its history.

**Common name** - This is usually the name by which a site is currently popularly identified. It may be the same as the historic name.

**Map/Lot Number** - Get this data from the Assessor's Office.

**UTM references** - Leave this field blank.

**Owner/Address** - The name and address of the property owner.

**Construction date** - If known, please indicate the exact date of construction (e.g. 1943 or 1842-43). If the exact date is not known, give the construction date by circa date. Source of date (e.g. 1806, 1841 and 1892 maps, stylistic evidence, cornerstone) should be cited.

**Architect and Builder** - Fill in if known. (Identify source of information.)

**Style** - Choose from the list below the style that best describes your house. If unknown, leave this field blank, and the Hampton Heritage Commission will help you to complete it.

**Roof/Chimneys** - The type of roof (e.g. gabled, Mansard, cross-gabled, jerkinhead) and number and location of chimneys (e.g. internal ridge, central, end). If you are unsure of how to complete this field, leave it blank, and the Hampton Heritage Commission will help you fill it in.

**Additional Architectural Description** – Provide any relevant information, if known.

**Photo** – Include at least one clear photograph of the front façade; detail photos or photos of other elevations may be helpful as well.

**Information on Foundations, Other Structures, and Landscape Features** – A brief description of the construction of your foundation. Indicate if there are any historic or significant outbuildings, such as a carriage house, barn, garden structure, or outhouse. Describe any significant landscape features.

**Surrounding environment** – Leave blank.

**Significance** – In your own words, tell us what you know about your house: what it looks like, who lived there, when it was built, how it is a part of Hampton's history.

**Original Use and Present Use** – Self-explanatory.

**Physical Condition** – Self-explanatory.

**Threats** - Leave blank.

**References** - What sources did you use to gather information about your house and its history (e.g. deeds, family history, maps, newspapers)?
