HHS barn project begins

HAMPTON | The area is cleared and the work has begun!

The Hampton Historical Society is getting ready to reconstruct the c.1796 barn that was acquired last year. The barn, to be used as educational, display and community space, will be rebuilt on the grounds of the Tuck Museum, located at 40 Park Avenue in Hampton.

An existing tree being removed to make space on the site has been a problem for the other museum buildings that are close by. Losing the tree will actually help preserve the buildings. Dave DeGagne, the HHS's buildings and grounds chairman, will be using lumber from the tree to make some benches for the Meeting

House Green area.

The foundation for the barn will be done soon; however, the rest of the reconstruction project is still on hold while monies needed are still being raised. So far, the HHS has raised about \$21,000 of the \$60,000 needed to rebuild the barn.

HAMPTON | Tragedy nearly befell two teenagers rescued Sunday afternoon while clutching an abutment of a Route 1A bridge after being swept into a fierce Hampton River current.

The teens were rescued by two members of New Hampshire Fish and Game.

The rescue was the second at the bridge in less than a week. The first involved two young men whose boat was swamped during a thunderstorm.

The teens rescued Sunday had reportedly been swimming off the Route 1A bridge. The younger of the teens got caught in the current, and when the second tried to help, they both

wound up in trouble.

Fish and Game personnel William Boudreau and McClare were patrolling the river and heard calls for help from people near the scene. They were able to pull the teens from the water.
