Tide Conversions

Tides vary by several minutes along the coastline due to geographical features (such as rivers) and their location. You may use this guide to gauge the correct time for high and low tides at other points along the Seacoast by adding or subtracting the appropriate number of minutes from the Hampton Harbor tides listed to the side. Please note that adverse weather and other events may alter these predictions.

York Harbor High Tide:

Subtract 11 minutes

Low Tide:

Subtract 19 minutes

Portsmouth High Tide:

Add 8 minutes

Low Tide:

Subtract 15 minutes

Merrimack River High Tide:

Add 6 minutes

Low Tide:

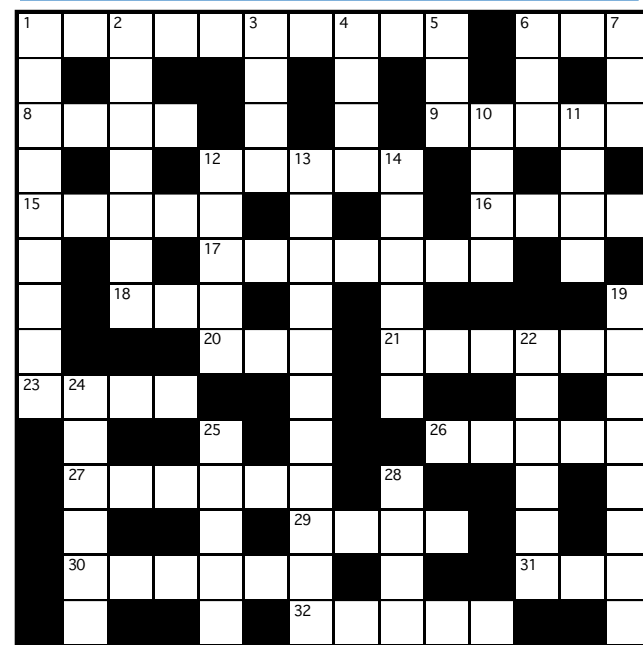
Subtract 8 minutes
