

#### New BFLF season at SSC

RYE | Parents can discover the wonders of nature with their preschoolers by taking part in the Seacoast Science Center's Big Fish, Little Fish (BFLF) program.

Registration is now open for BFLF, which begins on October 31 and November 1-3, meeting once a week for six weeks.

Conducted at the SSC at Odiorne Point in Rye, BFLF is organized by the age of the participating child. Sign up for Tuesdays, Wednesdays or Thursdays (ages 18 months to 3-1/2 years) from 10-11:30 a.m., or Fridays (ages 3-1/2 to 5) from 12:30-2 p.m.

BFLF teaches young children (and their favorite adult) about the natural environment through guided explo-

ration and hands-on discovery. During this session, participants will explore the "Winter Woodlands of Odiorne." They will follow the tracks of deer and fox (if there's snow), make fairy houses and search the shore for treasures.
