Firehouse welcomes Tom Rush



NEWBURYPORT | The Firehouse Center for the Arts is will present a special concert on Sunday, September 24 featuring a return appearance of folk legend, Tom Rush.

Rush, who has headlined sold-out concerts at Carnegie Hall and the Kennedy Center, will perform two shows on the Firehouse stage, the first being an afternoon concert at 3 p.m., the second in the evening at 7 p.m.

Rush introduced the world to the songs of Joni Mitchell, Jackson Browne and James Taylor more than 25 years ago, and has been captivating audiences throughout the country ever since with his ever romantic, gently rustic folk music.

Rush's appearance at the Firehouse be a very special day for him because earlier in the day his son, Ben, will open his photography exhib-

it, entitled "How it Was, Photographing Katrina."

A photographic journey recognizing the first year anniversary of Hurricane Katrina, the exhibit will be held from 1-2:30 p.m. in the lobby at the Provident Bank, located at 66 Storey Avenue in Newburyport. The public is invited to attend.

Ben's works will be on display, and some will be for sale, with a percentage of the sales being donated to the Firehouse Center for the Arts, located in downtown Newburyport. Tom will be there to say hello and to sing a few songs.

'Nunsense' opens in Amesbury

AMESBURY | The Valley Players presents the hilarious Dan Goggin musical comedy, "Nunsense," playing now through Sunday, September 17 at the Amesbury Playhouse Dinner Theatre, located at 194 Main Street

"Nunsense" begins when the Little Sisters of Hoboken discover that their cook, Sister Julia, Child of God, has accidentally poisoned 52 of the sisters, and they are in dire need of funds for the burials. The sisters decide that the best way to raise the money is to put on a variety show, so they take over the school auditorium, which is currently set up for the eighth grade production of "Grease."

Here the audience meets Reverend Mother Regina (played by Natalie MacBrien), a former circus performer; Sister Mary Hubert (Kate Richards), the Mistress of Novices; a streetwise nun from Brooklyn named Sister Robert Anne (Amy LeJeune); Sister Mary Leo (Ashley Korbey), a novice who is a wannabe ballerina; and the delightfully wacky Sister Mary Amnesia (Sally DeCost), the nun who lost her memory when a crucifix fell on her head.

Side-splitting jokes and show-stopping song and

dance numbers make up this madcap show that satirizes convent life with a hysterical anything-goes sense of fun

"Nunsense" hits the stage at the Amesbury Playhouse on Fridays and Saturdays, with dinner served at 7 p.m. followed by the show at 8:30 p.m.; two shows on Sundays (12 noon/1:30 p.m. and 5/6:30 p.m.); and two shows on Wednesday (12 noon/1:30 p.m. and 6/7:30 p.m.).
